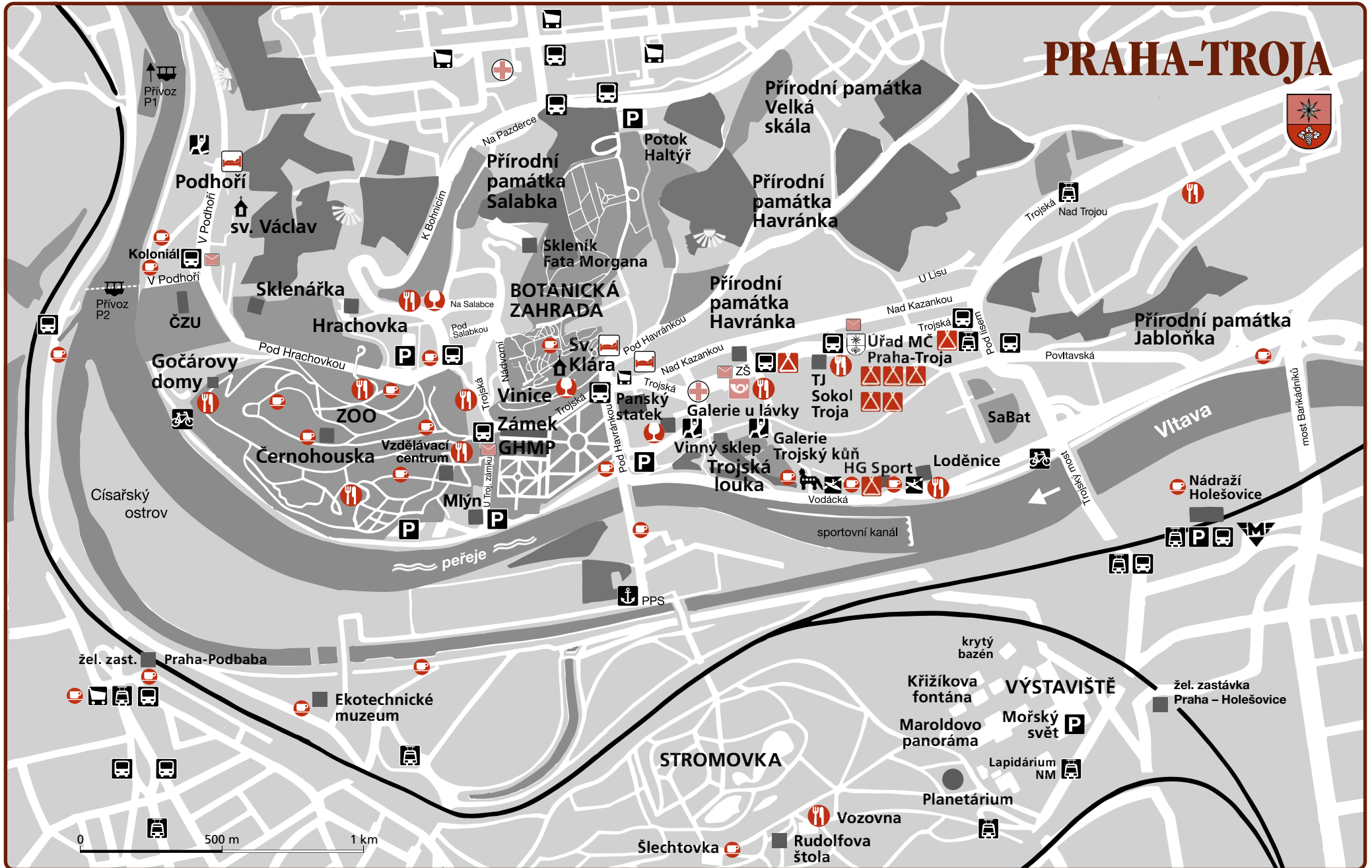

Municipal district of Praha-Troja was formed in 1992. The area of 336 h with its 1200 inhabitants is situated in the north of Prague, in the valley and on slopes on the right bank of the Vltava river.

The oldest written references to Troja date back to the 13th century. The name originally belonged just to the 17th century Troja Castle, the settlement did not receive it until the following century. The village of Troja, formerly Zadní Ovenec, was beyond the limits of the capital city of Prague until 1921. A suburban landscape is formed in a unique way by the river with many islands, Troja brae, hillocks, cloughs. A cultural landscape modified to small fields and grasslands, vineyards and orchards by generations, old settlement and later residential housing is preserved until today and is of a great value for its citizen.

Nowadays, Troja is a favourite destination not just for Prague citizens. It is full of life not only in Zoo's pavilions, Botanic garden's green-houses, castle's ostentatious halls. Sport facilities Loděnice, Sokol, Sabat, Tennis hall, new art gallery Trojský kůň, Gallery u lávky, activities of local high school and NGOs' guarantee an ongoing programme and lasting interest in Troja. Many of social events in Troja have become a tradition, such as the Grape Harvest, Opening of Wells with the parade of fairies and water sprites, the Cake of Troje competition in baking, Christmas concerts or regular art exhibitions.

Dear visitors, I believe this little map of Troja will become a good guide and an inspiration for visiting the lively places which are worth your attention. Have a pleasant and refreshing time in Praha-Troja!
